Port Hacking was well represented at Sail Port Stephens, and from that came some great results from CSC members. There is a wrap-up of the event later in this Mainsheet.



For some years we have seen restlessness amongst the yacht fleet. In the background your Sailing Committee has been exploring how best to invigorate and modernise the way we race. Rik, our SailSys manager, recently took the floor at a special Members and Skippers meeting, attended by 29 members, and talked us through the pros and cons of a range of options. To be transparent and democratic, a separate formal vote from each keelboat was then recorded.

The support vote for change to a course-based point score system was overwhelming. Your Sailing Committee now moves into a four stage process of defining the SailSys management parameters; compiling the 2024/25 racing Program; integrating the 2024/25 Course book; and updating the 2024/25 Sailing Instructions. We have an enthusiastic team, we will deliver before the summer season starts.

In the meantime, let's all enjoy some glorious Winter sailing. Don't forget each boat MUST enter the WInter series separately in SailSys to be eligible for a race result. See you out there.

Thank you for your passion, your dedication, and your unwavering support.






VJ INSTALLATION

IN OTHER NEWS

MG14 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The MG14 state titles were held at Toronto Amateur Sailing Club over two days from Saturday 9th March to Sunday 10th March. There were four Cronulla boats (Skol, Turtle, Smashed and Rum Rage) who made the trip up to Newcastle for the regatta.

Day 1 consisted of 3x back to back races. The winds were light with not quite enough wind for most to get out on trapeze but the sun came out for a treat and gave us a beautiful sunny day to start the series. It was close racing but a favoured side of the course saw some of the local boats come out on top.

Day 2 consisted of 2x races and after waiting for the wind to come in, it was smooth sailing from there. In race 1 Turtle pulled out a feat we haven't seen in months with Turtle finishing a race in front of Skol (with Skol remaining unbeaten this season until now) and Smashed not too far behind. Rum Rage had some unfortunate hardware malfunction which made for a tough series for

them.

SAIL PORT STEPHENS REGATTA

To our mind, the 2024 Sail Port Stephens regatta retained the title of New South Wales premier yachting event. This year four CSC boats and four RMYC-PH boats made the pilgrimage north. Sea Hawk represented CSC in the feeder Newcastle to Port Stephens ocean race, before joining Brand X, Jazz Bar, and Let's Go in the week-long Sail Port Stephens Commodores Cup Regatta. The fleet sizes were near record levels with 42 boats sailing the Nc2PS ocean race, and about 115 boats sailed across four divisions in the SPS Commodores Cup Regatta.

As is typical for that time of year, the breeze was generally light and fickle, the current strong, the sandbanks ever present, and the weather mostly clear and sunny. However some fortitude was needed on the last day of racing where miserable rain doused the smile off the face of every sailor. But for those sailors, a strong sense of personal achievement prevailed, and as is often the case in the sailing world, with that resilience comes upheaval of the final series results. We all certainly earned a beer after that last race!
