1. DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES

Sailability is a "not for profit", volunteer-based organisation that provides sailing activities and opportunities, enriching the lives of people of all abilities – the elderly, the financially and socially disadvantaged as well as people with physical challenges. All Sailability sailing events will be governed by the rules as defined in Marine Safety Act 1998, Marine Safety Regulation 2016 and the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGS)

All those taking part in a Sailability sailing event do so entirely at their own risk. The club will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in connection with or prior to, during, or after a Sailability event conducted at the club.

5. SAFFTY

Each boat participating in a Sailability sailing event shall carry the appropriate safety requirements of the NSW Maritime.

6. COURSE

Sailability Events will be conducted on the "Gunnamatta Bay Course" as defined in the Cronulla Sailing Club Course Book. Mark 2 and Mark 3, are at the northern end of Gunnamatta Bay. Mark 1 is at the southern end of the bay.
